Disclosure for Continuing Education 2021 MPL Association Conference

As a sponsor of continuing education (CE) programs, the MPL Association must ensure balance, independence and objectivity in all of its educational activities. Further disclosure must be given regarding any discussion of an experimental procedure or experimental use of medical equipment to be included in a clinical presentation, and any discussion of off label or investigational use of a product. The intent of the disclosure is not to prevent anyone named above from taking part in the planning and/or implementation of an educational activity, but rather to provide the MPL Association and its learners with pertinent information from which they can make their own judgments as to whether the speaker's interests or relationships may influence the presentation with regard to exposition or conclusion.
