
By laying out content and using color in a more predictable and perceivable way we can positively impact patients' success navigating through screens and ensure they successfully advance to their visit.

Feature Overview


The updates to this page are as follows:

- Added a header back to this page on the mobile web and the mobile app to improve navigation
- Changed the header titles from the primary color of the practice to black on the mobile web and the mobile app to increase accessibility and to reserve color for interactive components
- Left aligned all the section titles with the content inside the section on the mobile web and the mobile app for better readability
- Changed the section title font color to black to increase accessibility and to reserve color for interactive components on the mobile web and the mobile app
- Added the word Edit next to the pencil icon for clarity on web, mobile web and the mobile app
- Moved the edit option to the top of each section for better predictability on where to find it on web, mobile web and the mobile app
- Removed the pharmacy icon in the pharmacy section to increase space on web, mobile web and the mobile app
- Added a sticky footer to better show the need to scroll and that more action needs to be taken in order to advance on web, mobile web and the mobile app
