

Risk of Unknown COVID-19 Exposure Assessment

Low Risk Considered low risk if ALL of the following are met in the past 14-days: Does not work/live in area of high COVID-19 exposure. Works from home Part of small cohort (15 or less) who consistently practices physical distancing and masking No guests in home in past 14 days Only visits resident(s) in one site in a day Makes essential outings only Uses own vehicle Consistently maintains 2-metres of physical distance from those outside household Mask worn when not physical-distancing Consistent hand hygiene No interprovincial travel in last 14 days

Medium Risk

There are many activities between the extremes of high and low risk of unknown exposure.

Individuals who are coming for visits at an AgeCare community must use their best judgement to determine their own risk of unknown exposure in the past 14-days when neither low nor high is appropriate.

High Risk

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Considered high risk if <u>one or more</u> of the following are met in the past 14-days:	
	Works/lives in area of high COVID-19 exposure.
	Works outside home where distancing/masking not consistently maintained
	Part of large cohort (over 15)
	Cohort inconsistently practices physical distancing and use of masks
	Had guests in home in past 14 days
	Worked at/visited location with declared COVID-19 outbreak in last 14 days
	Visits resident(s) in multiple sites in one day
	Outings where contact with others outside household is likely
	Uses public transit/carpooling where physical distancing and masking is inconsistent
	Does not maintain physical distancing or wear a mask
	Inconsistent hand hygiene
	Interprovincial travel in last 14 days
