## & PREVENTION TIPS

### Top Poisonous Foods (12.1%)

-  Chocolate (10.7%)
-  Xylitol (artificial sweetener)
-  Grapes & Raisins
-  Onions & Garlic
-  Protein Bars
-  Avocado (skin, pit)
-  Alcohol, Coffee & Tea
-  Peaches, Plumbs & Apples (pits)
-  Raw Food (eggs, meat, fish)
-  Yeast Dough

### Most Common Non-Food Dog Poisons

-  OTC Medications (19.7%)
-  Prescriptions (17.2%)
-  Household Items (7.3%)
-  Rodenticides (6.3%)
-  Plants (5.5%)

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### Tip 1

**KEEP HARMFUL ITEMS OUT OF YOUR DOG'S REACH.**

Think of your dog as a toddler exploring where they shouldn't. Items such as cleaners, laundry soap, medicines and other toxic things should be put away.

### Tip 2

**EDUCATE OTHERS.**

Be sure everyone who cares for your dog knows what's on this list. Print it out. Show them. Discuss it.

### Tip 3

**TEACH A "LEAVE IT" COMMAND.**

"Leave it!" is the most important command your dog should know. Practice it. Reward it.

### Tip 4

**CALL FOR HELP.**
