Career Stories

Grades 7-12

Introduction

In this activity, students access their YouScience Discovery results to explore multiple career options and the daily tasks required for each. Words and images help students dig deeper into their results and tell the story of one of their selected careers.

- Access to YouScience Discovery results
- Copies of Career Stories Research Graphic Organizer (7–8 or 9–12)
- Career Stories Template Worksheet (6 frame or 8 frame)

Core Tasks

Get Started

• Instruct students to log in to their YouScience account (details on page 2).

GRADES 7-8

Research

- Give a copy of the <u>Career Stories Research Graphic Organizer (Grades 7–8)</u> from page 5 to each student to record their choices on.
- Guide students to the green View Career Matches button at the bottom of their Explore More of Your Talents section.
- Direct students to Sort By: Aptitude Fit, choose one of the career clusters displayed on their Your Careers page and record the cluster.
- Students will review possible careers and select three careers to learn more about and record them on the graphic organizer.
- Lead students to click on each of the careers they selected and review the A Day in
 the Life section and Core Tasks for each. After reviewing the three careers, have
 students rank them from 1 to 3 based on the tasks they might enjoy.
- Have students record their number one career choice, select 6 typical tasks or actions described and record them in the box provided.
- Have students can repeat these steps and **Sort By: Interest Fit**. This gives students more material for their career storyboard.

GRADES 9-12

Research

- Give a copy of the <u>Career Stories Research Graphic Organizer (Grades 9–12)</u> from page 6 to each student to record their choices on.
- Guide students to the purple **Best Fit Careers** card on their YouScience Discovery results home page.
- Direct students to **Sort By: Overall Fit**, review possible careers, select three careers to learn more about and record them on the graphic organizer.
- Lead students to click on each of the careers they selected and review the **A Day in the Life** section and **Core Tasks** for each.

 After reviewing the three careers, have students rank them from 1 to 3 based on the tasks they might enjoy. *Encourage* students to read through all of the core tasks before ranking the careers.
- Have students record their number one career choice, select 6 of the tasks described and record the tasks in the box provided. 3
- Have students repeat these steps two times as they choose, **Sort By: Aptitude Fit** and **Sort By: Interest Fit**. This gives students more material for their career storyboard.

GRADES 7-12

Create

- Give a copy of the <u>Career Stories Storyboard Template w/6 Panels</u> from page 7 to each student and lead students to select one career from their research.
- Have students create a 6-panel storyboard that highlights the tasks performed in the career. Students can choose to add a transition to their story if the tasks take place in different places or over multiple days.
- Encourage students to be creative in communicating the career through words and images.

Virtual Adaptation (find examples on pages 3 and 4)

- 1. Use storyboardthat.com to create comic style storyboards with graphic characters. *If you don't currently use* <u>StoryboardThat, try</u> <u>the educator account free for two weeks.</u> Students can also use the individual account and create two free storyboards each week.
- 2. Use canva.com to create photo or comic style storyboards. Search for storyboard templates in the Canva platform. *Canva for Education* is *free for educators and students*.

Extensions

- 1. Have students use a storyboard to create a short children's story about a fictional character's experience in their chosen career.
- 2. Collaborate with ELA, Art, and/or Graphic Design teachers to develop a cross-curricular project.
- 3. Use the 8-panel storyboard on page 8 to let students showcase more tasks and add more detail.





He watches the athletes and talks to their coaches to determine who will be a good fit for the team he represents.




When he is back in the office, Scout studies statistics about the athletes' performance.
