

This fun game will encourage your team to think ‘outside-the-box’ and draw on a range of subject knowledge. The purpose is for everyone to learn about things that aren’t necessarily in their area of interest and expand thinking and knowledge in those areas.

RESOURCES

- Paper for writing
- Pens/pencils
- List of topic and categories, for example:
 - Topic is ‘New Zealand’
 - Categories are towns/cities, rivers, mountains, and weather

GAME

- Split team into pairs/small groups or this could be an individual challenge
- Ask them to note down the topic and categories on their pieces of paper
- Choose a letter (A-Z) at random and give the team 1-2 minutes (depending on how many categories) to think of a word for each category, beginning with that letter
- Once the time is up, allocate one point for each correct answer
- Repeat the game with different letters

EXAMPLE

Topic: New Zealand

Categories: Towns/cities, rivers, mountains, and weather

Letter chosen: Start with M, then if you have time move on to other letters

Answers could be:

	M	C	R
Towns/cities	<i>Masterton</i>	<i>Christchurch</i>	<i>Raglan</i>
Rivers	<i>Manawatu</i>	<i>Clutha</i>	<i>Rakaia</i>
Mountains	<i>Murchison</i>	<i>Cook</i>	<i>Ruapehu</i>
Weather	<i>Mist</i>	<i>Cyclone</i>	<i>Rain</i>
