FMCSA's SMS Portal

- Scroll to the center of the page, navigate to the 'Help' tab on the top of the screen
 - Select 'Take a Tour'
 - Select 'How to Improve'
 - Select the question that interests you
 - Select 'FAQs'
 - Select 'Using the SMS Website' tab
 - Click the question: Why should a motor carrier log in to the Safety Measurement System (SMS)?
- Click on SMS logo banner near the top to return to the SMS website
 - Navigate to the center of the page and locate the title 'Learn about SMS'
 - Select 'Review the seven Behavior Analysis and Safety Improvement Categories (BASIC)' – a new tab will open
 - Scroll down to 'CSA Resources'
 - Select 'Safety Management Cycles'
 - Safety Management Cycles (SMC) are available for all the Behavior Analysis and Safety Improvement Categories (BASIC).
 - These are Tools motor carriers can use to establish and improve appropriate safety management controls.
- Navigate back to the SMS website
- Select 'SEARCH' on the top menu bar
 - Search by DOT# or Carrier Name.
 - Public information is limited. Motor carriers should log into the FMCSA website to get detailed information that includes driver names.

CAB Reports – subscriber.cabadvantage.com

- The CAB Motor Carrier Program provides similar data as SMS does for carriers that log in. This information is used by insurance companies and other organizations to gauge a motor carrier's performance.
- CAB is offered at no cost to Great West insureds and provides useful data for tracking driver and vehicle performance for motor carriers. Only motor carrier data is viewable with this program.
