THE IMPORTANCE OF IMMUNIZATIONS

For your safety and the safety of the patients you will be working with, AMO and our physicians require you to complete all vaccinations prior to your rotation start date. We understand they can be time-consuming and costly, but vaccinations must be a priority when planning for your rotation. Failure to provide all required immunizations may result in a delayed start date or even cancellation.

By having the proper immunizations, you can decrease your chances of sickness in the United States. This is especially important while traveling as dehydration from flying, a change in dietary habits and less sleep (all possible during your rotation in the U.S.) can lower your immune system's response, making it more difficult to fight off disease.

Completing your required immunizations in a timely manner will help ensure the rotation start date is not delayed and can help make sure that the only thing you bring back to your home country are souvenirs and possibly a letter of recommendation from your supervising physician.
