AMOpportunities works with academic institutions, teaching hospitals, and leading high-quality health care systems to provide international medical students and graduates with clinical rotations in the U.S. We've placed more than 2,600 international medical students and graduates 225 clinical sites across the country.





Kyle Swinsky and Benjamin Bradley founded AMOpportunities in 2013 as University of Wisconsin-Madison students. The two built the organization to provide international medical students and graduates with clinical rotations in the United States through their on-demand clinical platform that allows students to select their location, specialty, month, and type of rotation. They understood that the U.S. needs these trainees as it faces an impending physician shortage and a lack of care in rural and impoverished areas of the country.

Since its founding, AMOpportunities has grown considerably, obtaining \$4.1 million in total funding from investors and creating meaningful partnerships with institutions such as University of Miami, Saint Anthony Hospital, Georgetown University and the University of Chicago to connect those rotating with high-quality experiences. These partnerships allow AMOpportunities to provide foreign medical trainees with exclusive, trusted learning opportunities that will help further their medical career.

AMOpportunities provides its visitors with concierge-level support at every stage of their rotation. We value the education and future career paths of our participants. Our team of advisors, visitor experiences coaches, rotations coordinators, and directors are dedicated to ensuring visitors achieve their educational goals. We strive to meet the needs of our visitors from the start of their application process to the end of their rotation.

It is our hope that with these educational experiences, students can create professional networks and have real-world medical experiences that will help them move closer to their goals of becoming health care professionals.

AMOPPORTUNITIES ACCOMPLISHMENTS

To date, AMOpportunities has helped 2,600-plus international medical students and graduates secure and complete rotations across 40 medical specialties and subspecialties located at 225 clinical sites. These students have developed long-lasting relationships with their supervising physicians and secured letters of recommendation that are needed to match into U.S. residency programs.

Since 2013, AMOpportunities has built partnerships with I e ading educational institutions and hospitals such as Saint Anthony Hospital, Weiss Memorial Hospital, University of Chicago, University of Illinois Chicago, University of Miami, and Georgetown University. Students who apply and enroll in a rotation with AMOpportunities can feel comfortable they are making a safe and invaluable investment in their future.
