

A photo of your hospital or clinic site is a chance to make a first impression on future trainees. Use these tips to help take great photos that best represent your program.

## WHY TAKE A PROGRAM PHOTO

Program photos help trainees gain a better idea of where they will be rotating and help your rotation stand out on our website. Without a photo submitted directly from your team, we only have access to Google photos. This often results in misrepresentations of your program.

## TIPS FOR AN EFFECTIVE PHOTO

1. Photos should be a landscape photo taken of the clinical site where trainees will be rotating.

2. Photos should be clear of potential accidental subjects such as cars, people, or dumpsters.

3. Take your photo before or after office hours to limit the amount of extra traffic outside of your hospital or clinical site.

4. Represent your program's warm and welcoming atmosphere by taking photos on clear-weather days.

5. Consider the angle of the photograph. Eye level may not always be the best angle to represent your clinical site.
