Bullying Session

This past Monday, I hosted a Google Meet session for Middle School families around bullying. The purpose was to share the definition of bullying and the four types of bullying. Second, I wanted to make participants aware of the Ignite MS Scholar Conflict Form and support personnel in the school who are on hand to support scholars and you as family members. I sent out those resources, including a link to our school's Anti-Bullying Policy. I concluded by offering parents a partnership so that together we can prevent bullying by communicating with one another. Pay attention to any changes you notice in your child. Reach out to teachers, who have the most direct impact on your child while at school and talk with your child every day not just about academics, but their peer relationships and their social-emotional wellness. When we know more, we can do more. When we know better, we can do better together. We cannot underestimate these formative years in Middle School where scholars are getting to know themselves and the world around them, who they can trust, who their friends are and who they aren't. They are taking risks intellectually and outwardly. Things that happen can affect our scholars in myriad ways. We want those experiences more positive than negative.


