









<p>DRY VANS</p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Versatile and able to accommodate many types of freight Freight is protected from the elements Additional protection from cargo theft Relatively affordable 							
<p>STRAIGHT FRAME FLATBEDS</p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Most continuous loading space (up to 53') Can haul the most weight compared to other trailers with same number of axles At dock-loading height Perfect for construction site crane or forklift offloading 							
<p>DROP DECKS, STEP DECKS & SINGLE DROP TRAILERS</p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Two separate decks (top and bottom) and deck heights Bottom deck allows loads to be 1' 8" –2' taller and remain legal compared to straight frame flatbeds 							
<p>DOUBLE DROP & LOWBOY TRAILERS</p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Three separate decks (two top and one bottom) and two deck heights Bottom deck allows loads to be 1'-1' 4" taller and remain legal compared to drop decks, step decks and single drop trailers 							
<p>REMOVABLE GOOSENECK (RGN) TRAILERS</p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Three separate decks (two top and one bottom) and two deck heights Bottom deck allows loads to be 1'-1' 4" taller and remain legal compared to drop decks, step decks and single drop trailers Removable neck allows equipment to drive directly onto them 							
<p>SPECIALTY HEAVY HAUL TRAILERS</p>   <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Designed to ship specific types of equipment 7-19-axle trailers can accommodate up to 200,000 pounds
