

THROUGH-TRAILER

A method of shipping that allows you to cross international borders — like
Canada and Mexico — without transloading. While the tractor typically changes, this method keeps your freight in the same trailer from origin to final destination — minimizing risk.

CROSS-DOCKING

A method of shipping where freight on an inbound trailer is reloaded onto an outbound trailer before continuing to its final destination into or out of Mexico — typically with little or no storage in between. This is the most common practice for getting freight across international borders.
