You are asking for an Icon – we are proposing an Iconic Experience in this open and accessible park, through San Jose history, environment, discovery, and technology. It is a journey of our past, present, and future.

History lives along the Guadalupe Parkway through what remains of a historic neighborhood. Within these buildings, alleyways, and gardens, old and new, people will find restaurants and areas for activities and entertainment to leave the city buzz and relax under an open sky. As you walk into the greenbelt of the park it will be a journey of discovery through trees and paths along the river as well as unique spots of augmented reality scenes. We will move into the future with Bookable Workspaces along the river. Live, work, discover and enjoy all together.

Crossing over the river you will arrive to an iconic open building, the Net Zero **Academy of Art, Science and Technology**. It will drape across the river, connecting both sides of the park. People will continue the virtual reality experience that teaches as well as entertains. Augmented reality provides interactive experiences in a real-world environment. Hands on discovery activities will educate on the ecological, economic, and cultural significance of San Jose. There will be a living rooftop, with a Farm to Table dining that will look out over the city paying homage to the former Valley of Hearts Delight, as well as indigenous Bay Area plants.

At a time when our city is growing with new high rises popping up everywhere, the Guadalupe Parkway provides elements of air, water, and land.
