CONCEPT



This Monument states the belief that humanity can, and will, go on improving and getting closer on the path to a more united and fair World for new generations.


LIGHTENING

Thanks to neural circuit cameras, the monument lightening is not stationary, but depends on how much people are present in the area next to the Monolith. 







THE MONOLITH PLAN




The Monolith has a base of an approximate circumference of 90 feet. The path that leads to the monument inside is shaped to avoid the sight of the chamber from outside generating curiosity.

This cavernous passage resembles the way of humankind towards knowledge.

APPROCHING THE MONOLITH




The vegetation in Arena Green and the surrounding buildings make difficult to see the base of the Monolith, the walk towards its discovery starts from the distance.



The Monolith height is 200 feet from the ground level, but it rises from a hollow that makes it even taller. The hollow generates a kind of theatre of which the Monolith is the protagonist, increasing its impressiveness while descending to his base to find the entrance.

Everybody can go to the entrance. The base is accessible either with stairs or a long ramp.





The inner chamber represents the abstraction only humankind can achieve. Its surfaces are made of a smooth mirroring material sparkling with different colors, slightly inspired by the silicon carbide. 






TIME and AGING —


The passage of time does not make the monument old and outmoded; instead, it improves its beauty and strengthen the concept of opposition between organic shapes and the internal cubic chamber.




Delmas Ave View
