"<u>Genius and Grace</u> The Campanile

The campanile is a 150' bell tower steel, concrete and granite with a campanile at the top. The campanile tower is "rooted" 20' into the ground to secure it against earthquakes. The tower is equipped with a computer screen on each of the four sides. The tower scrolls interesting facts about the San Jose are but does not show ads or other commercial images.

The campanile is energy independent. Solar panels cover the roof and strategic sides of the tower. There is a battery and connection to the utility grid. Eight large benches surround the tower—two on the east, west, north and south sides. One bench contains a time capsule.

The campanile is designed with lighting that is pointed down to the lawn, walkways and benches. The campanile benches each have images of the past, present and future as follows:
