A place where ideas are born.

The "Dream Catcher" site is an interesting architectural building located at the confluence of the Guadalupe river and Los Gatos Creek and is the fruit of inspiration, innovation and development.

The construction on the site depicts a living legend about the "Dream Catcher" amulet. The Turtle island is formed in the center of a small lake under the bridge of the construction that gives an opportunity for recreation and breeding of turtles. Stone blocks, placed around the perimeter of the island, create a favorable atmosphere for nesting waterfowl. Also, these blocks create quiet backwaters where salmon can rest during migration. The lake is spanned by a bridge in the form of large bent willow trees, under which the conditions for possible habitation of bats are taken into account.

The construction consists of three levels:

The first (lower) level consists of an arch with four external staircases and two blocks with elevators, as well as evacuation exits located on opposite banks;

The second (middle) level is a block of two floors, on the sides of which there are restaurants, bars, cafeterias, and shops. In the center of the block is the main entrance area of the Museum;

The third (upper) level is a Museum with an observation platform, in the center of which is the "Dream Catcher" ring.

Various types of willow are planted on the roof surface, from large trees at the top to shrub species at the base of the roof. Also, during the year, the color of the roof will change depending on the season, shimmering from green to yellow and red. The total height of the building is 197 foot.

At the confluence of the Guadalupe river and Los Gatos Creek, we also plan to unite man and nature.
