What should I bring with me if I need to meet with the Anesthesiologist before my surgery?

• Bring your medicines and any information about your health.

Can I eat or drink anything before my surgery?

• Do **not** eat or drink after midnight, the night before your surgery.

What should I bring to the hospital on the day of surgery?

• Bring a list of all your medicines (the names, amounts and how often you take the medicines).

If I have a cold during the week before my surgery, what should I do?

Call your surgeon.

Who should I bring with me on the day of surgery if I do not speak or understand English?

- Please bring an adult who speaks and understands English so that he or she can translate for you.
- If there is no adult who speaks and understands English that can come with you we will provide someone who will be able to translate for you.

What medicines should I take or not take on the day of my surgery?

- If you have any questions call your surgeon.
- Take medicines on the day of surgery with only a **small** sip of water.
