

COVID-19 CONTINGENCY PLANNING:

Course Sharing Strategies to Expand Your Catalog and Minimize Enrollment Fallout

The COVID-19 pandemic continues to negatively impact student retention and is predicted to have lasting effects for semesters to come. To meet this threat, institutions are leveraging Acadeum Course Share $^{\text{TM}}$ to keep students progressing toward their degrees and stay connected to their home institutions.

Unlike courses on Course Share™ which leverage the consortial model, courses taken on a transfer basis will often not meet degree requirements. Communicate to students and their parents how your catalog of courses, supplemented by the Acadeum network, will create the fastest path to completing a degree.
	Reach out to withdrawn or dropped students and their parents to prove how your institution can quickly get them back on track to graduation through a combination of your institution's and Acadeum's courses. Keep in mind that providing additional course options is not only a strategy to keep students from leaving, but also to bring students back.
I have students that are struggling academically and are near or on probation.	Keep all your students moving forward by quickly helping some students recover academically.
