EXPERIENCE

Scavenger hunt

Print out one of the scavenger hunt lists of your choice. Look at the list with your child and read each of the objects to be found. Prepare your environment so these items are mostly available. Some could be hidden, placed up high or low. Use language as you interact with your child which describes the places they have found objects e.g. underneath, behind, on top, below, next to.
