- 5 Why is mercy a truer test of orthodoxy than theological acumen?
- 6 What was the point of the story Ray told about the pastor who embedded himself in AA?

THE MARKS OF GOSPEL ORTHODOXY – REST

- 7 How did the Pharisees turn the Sabbath into a burden rather than a joy?
- 8 What do you think the Sabbath teaches us about God and ourselves?
- 9 Why are youth sports, trips to Disney, and sleeping in detrimental to the Sabbath? What do you typically do on the Sabbath? What might you need to change about how you spend your Sabbath?
- 10 What is the difference between physical rest and soul rest? How do you achieve soul rest? Why did Ray mention "June-teenth"?

- In what areas of faith and practice are you feeling convicted by the Holy Spirit to act as a result of this study?
