- 4 How would you respond to someone who says, "I don't believe in Christianity because it offends me" or "I don't believe in Christianity because I don't like it"? Discuss the following quote.

I believe in Easter. I believe in the traditions. I believe in the flowers. I believe in the beauty. I believe in the meals. I believe in family getting together. I believe

in the love that sort of pervades Easter, and the warmth that you feel from these traditions, and the meals, and the worship. When the Apostles Creed is said," she said, "I say it. When the Doxology is sung, tears roll down my face. I believe in Easter I just don't believe in Jesus."

- 6 How is the end of Saving Private Ryan not a picture of the gospel?

- 7 How was the apostle Paul an example of the power of God to change a life? The video featured people whose lives were changed because of Jesus: "I was...then I met Jesus...now..." What would have been your story if you had been in the video?
- 8 How was the story of the father who dove into a septic tank to save his son an illustration of Christianity?

THE RESURRECTION: GLORIOUS FUTURE

- 9 The resurrection means that you will get the life back you always wanted. Your best years are yet to come. What do you hope you will experience when you are resurrected?
- 10 Death takes us away from our loved ones, but resurrection promises reunion. Who do you look forward to being reunited with in heaven?
