"The Blessing – Episode 2"

Ephesians 1:7-14 Rev. Adam Jones, August 30 & 31, 2014

Step 1: Reflect on the Text

Why do we do this first? We always want to start with the Bible. The goal is to meditate on the Word and read it with an ear sensitive to the Holy Spirit's promptings. Look for words or phrases that stand out through logic, repetition, layout, etc.

Read Ephesians 1:7-14. What stood out to you? What did you find interesting and/or important? What was challenging or caused you to have questions?

Step 2: Reflect on the Sermon

INTRODUCTION

- 1 Our lives are often fractured and dysfunctional, and as a result we experience vertigo in our souls. What is something that has recently left you feeling confused, discouraged, or full of doubt?
- 2 Summarize the *Big Idea* of the sermon in *one phrase or sentence* (Note: this is not the same as listing the main points). In other words, if someone woke you up at 3am on Monday morning and asked, "What was the sermon about on Sunday?" what would you say in the midst of your sleepy haze?

- 9 The riots in St. Louis are just a picture of a greater worldwide problem caused by sin and the fall. In our hearts we wonder, "when will all the riots be over?" What present day "riots" will be ended in the new heavens and new earth?
