





2. WHY IS THERE NO BETTER TIME TO MAKE THE SHIFT TO AESTHETIC NURSING?




The rise and popularity of Botox® and Injectable Fillers has changed the way society approaches aging. Younger generations are embracing injectables as preventative anti-aging procedures or to enhance what nature gave them.

Furthermore, the advancement of lasers and energy devices to treat a myriad of cosmetic concerns from excess fat, unwanted body hair, tattoos, and skin imperfections, has contributed to the global aesthetic medicine market's projected worth of USD \$124.7 billion by 2028¹. Paired with increased social acceptance, and the fact that 83% of consumers worldwide are willing to invest in their appearance², Aesthetic Medicine is a rapidly growing, feel-good industry with high patient satisfaction rates.

According to Allergan's 360 Aesthetics Report

82% of millennial consumers, aged 21-35, believe injectable treatments are socially acceptable, and a whopping 98% of millennial consumers worldwide would consider a professional treatment at some point in their lives.²

The rise in popularity of Aesthetic Treatments is not just limited to millenial patients.

Baby Boomers with disposable incomes are also embracing the antiaging benefits of non-invasive treatments. Statistics released by the American Society of Plastic Surgeons revealed a growth of nearly 50,000 more cosmetic procedures in 2018, compared to 2017, in Americans aged 55 and older.

Medical aesthetic market awareness is being driven by massive direct-to-consumer spending by pharmaceutical and device companies. Aesthetic market leader Allergan (whose product portfolio includes Botox®, Juvéderm®, Kybella®, CoolSculpting®, CoolTone®, DiamondGlow™, and SkinMedica®) spent \$150 million on their direct-to-consumer marketing alone in 2020, up from the \$55 million they spent between 2015 and 2017.³ As the industry's biggest player, this will only further increase the public awareness and popularity of aesthetic treatments.




Looking beyond injectables, innovative non-invasive laser and device procedures are being embraced more and more by consumers who historically avoided the time and expense involved with invasive procedures. According to a report published by Acumen Research and Consulting, the global medical laser market size is poised to grow at a CAGR (compound annual growth rate) of 10.8% during the forecast period 2019 to 2026, to reach around US \$16.4 billion by 2026.4



More Flexibility = Better Work/Life Balance

In this era of healthcare change, nurses at the forefront of patient care are experiencing a heavier, more demanding workload than ever before. Emotional and physical exhaustion is commonplace for nurses. A 2017 study found that 42% of registered nurses said they suffered from severe stress, and 45% were tired of their jobs.⁵

In addition, the traumatic and difficult patient care situations caused by the COVID-19 pandemic has escalated this emotional exhaustion, leaving many nurses in a state of burnout, suffering from PTSD, anxiety, and depression.

From June to September 2020, Mental Health America (MHA) conducted an online survey of healthcare workers to listen to their experiences during the COVID-19 pandemic. Of the 1,119 healthcare workers surveyed, 76% reported exhaustion and burnout.⁶

Making a difference in patients' lives is the core of the nursing profession, but many critical care nurses place their own self-care at the bottom of the priority list, leaving them exhausted and running on empty.

By choosing a more flexible career in Aesthetic Medicine, nurses can have more control over their level of stress, achieve a better work-life balance, and avoid burnout, while still achieving the satisfaction of providing quality, meaningful patient care.

What is **Burnout?**

Burnout Syndrome is a combination of exhaustion, cynicism, and perceived inefficacy resulting from longterm job stress.⁵

In a 2020 study, 54% of the 1,688 direct care nurses surveyed suffered from moderate burnout, with emotional exhaustion scores increasing by 10% and cynicism scores increasing 19% after 1 year.⁷

Higher nurse workloads have been related to Burnout Syndrome. A 2017 study discovered 49% of Registered Nurses under the age of 30, and 40% over the age of 30 have experienced symptoms of burnout.8

The financial benefits of a career in Aesthetic Medicine are compelling. According to ZipRecruiter, the national average salary for an Aesthetic Nurse is around \$90,000. As with most professions, nurses with higher levels of experience and training receive the highest level of compensation.

Industry financial benchmarking data shows RN Injectors in the 90th percentile made \$181,000 last year, and NP Injectors in the 90th percentile made \$291,000! Fueled with an entrepreneurial spirit and solid business acumen, earning potential can be exponential and virtually limitless.



START YOUR OWN MEDSPA


