

Member Spotlight – Miron Construction

Founded in 1918, Miron Construction Co., Inc., is one of the top construction firms in the United States. Family values, firm handshakes, integrity and hard work have kept the family-owned company in business for 103-years. However, what may have set the table for its success were simple buckets.

According to Jen Bauer, senior vice president of marketing and culture at Miron Construction, when the company was in its infancy, with less than 35 employees, everyone would gather in the shop after work and take a seat on an overturned bucket.

“It didn’t matter if you were a mason, a site superintendent or the president of the company; everyone was welcome and everyone was family,” Bauer explained. “[Team members] would discuss project challenges and celebrate successes but, more importantly, they’d share stories about their lives outside of the office and away from the field. They would bond over heartache and laughter, all while building life-long friendships.”

That culture still exists at Miron Construction and may very

well be at the center of their astronomical success.

Headquartered in Neenah, Wisconsin, Miron Construction has grown to 1600 employees and seven offices. The company has received countless awards and accolades; the company is ranked 183 on the Engineering News-Record’s (ENR) “Top 250 Global Contractors” list, an impressive leap of 31 spots from its 2020 ranking of 214. Miron also ranks 68 nationally on ENR’s “Top 400 Contractors” list and eighth amongst ENR Midwest’s “Top Contractors” list.

“We have been very fortunate to be acknowledged and recognized for our work,” Bauer noted. “It’s simply a testament to our team members and their ability to be incredible stewards of our clients, always delivering on their promises in regard to quality, schedule and price.”

Although Miron Construction is “homegrown,” its projects reach far beyond Wisconsin’s borders.

“[We] have worked throughout the Midwest for many years. In the past decade, we’ve expanded geographically and have taken on more national work,

often traveling at the request of our clients. In fact, last year we put work in place in 22 states,” Bauer shared. “But all that said, we are extremely proud of the work we do locally.”

The company recently completed several major projects that will help improve and revitalize the Greater Green Bay area, including a new manufacturing facility for Green Bay Packaging, the Resch Expo, Brown County STEM Innovation Center and several other facilities in the Titledown Development. They also serve as the Official Provider of Construction Services for the Green Bay Packers and Lambeau Field and just celebrated the grand opening of its sixth satellite office location in Titledown.

“I am so proud to share that we have seen astounding growth over the years and that’s a direct reflection of the dedicated individuals we have on our team,” said Bauer. “It’s a thrilling time to be in our industry and we look forward to both the challenges and the successes that lie ahead.”
